



Parent/Child Format

Course: Pinehurst No. 6

Age Group: Girls 11-12: USKG Tee 4 (Back 9)

Tee times start: Tee time is listed on your scorecard and cart sign.

Lunch: Provided to all participants following their round (Parent and Child).

Format: Modified Scramble – Only parents will tee off on holes highlighted in yellow and only kids will tee off on holes highlighted in green. Competitors will scramble for the remainder of the hole. Both players will tee off on all holes not highlighted and select the best tee shot

Scorecards: Scorecards will be distributed at the starting tee. Team score will be recorded on each scorecard. You will keep your competitor's score. Scores will be verbally agreed upon and totaled following your round at the scoring table. Please report the scoring area immediately after completion of play.

Tees: All players will play from U.S. Kids Golf Tee Markers

Awards: Trophies will be presented to 1st and 2nd place in each age group. There will be no awards presentation on site, as players are asked to leave the facility following the round. Winners will be announced online and trophies will be available for pickup at the Pinehurst Resort. We will email winners with pickup information.

Tiebreaker: U.S. Kids Golf Scorecard Playoff will be used to break ties for all awards. Winner will be determined on the basis of the team score on the last six holes, last three holes and finally the last hole of the competition course. If the teams are still tied, continue backwards from the last hole until a winner is determined. (The “last six holes, last three holes, etc.” is considered to be 3-9, 6-9, etc.)

Players must place their ball within one club length of the shot selected, no nearer to the hole. Players' ball must remain in the same condition as the shot selected, i.e. fairway, rough, or sand. Play is governed by the USGA Rules of Golf and Decisions, the US Kids Golf Foundation Rules and Regulations, and by the following Local Rules:

BUNKERS: Bunkers are defined as sandy areas completely enclosed by sod.

SANDY AREAS: All sandy/natural areas, not completely enclosed by sod, are deemed to be in the general area. These areas are not bunkers, and the clubhead may be grounded. Note: there is no free relief for an embedded ball in loose sand in these areas.

GROUND UNDER REPAIR: A) Areas completely encircled by white lines. B) French drains filled with rocks or stones. C) Cut Turf (Newly Sodded areas) even if unmarked.

ROADS AND PATHS: Artificially surfaced paths are deemed obstructions. All other paths are deemed integral parts of the course. Any white lined areas tying into roads or paths are deemed to be part of the same cart path obstruction. Wood pilings and large rocks (not small stones) adjacent to artificially surfaced cart paths are deemed to be part of the same obstruction.

STONES IN BUNKERS: Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions and may be moved without penalty.

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS CLOSE TO PUTTING GREEN: If a ball lies off the putting green but not in a hazard and such an obstruction on or within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief as follows: the ball must be lifted and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay which (a) is not nearer the hole, (b) avoids such intervention and (c) is not in a hazard or on a putting green. The ball may be cleaned when so lifted.

EDGING GROOVES – If a ball lies in or on an edging groove around the putting green, or if the groove interferes with the area of intended swing, the ball may, without penalty, be lifted, cleaned and placed in the nearest position to where it lay that is not nearer the hole and avoids interference by the condition whether on or off the putting green.
