

2025 U.S. Kids Golf European Championship Craigielaw Golf Club – Local Rules

Play is governed by the Rules of Golf and its interpretations, the U.S. Kids Golf Foundation International Championship Rules & Regulations, and by the following Local Rules:

RULES/TOURNAMENT HOTLINE: If, during your round, you need a ruling or rules official assistance, please call the tournament hotline at **+1 850.375.9221 or +39 331 867 4609**. Cell phones may ONLY be used by a player or caddie to **1**) access tournament information, **2**) obtain yardages via GPS, **3**) contact the rules hotline, or **4**) in emergency situations. Cell phones may not be used for any other purpose.

INTEGRAL OBJECTS: Stone walls, shelters and their hardstandings and any "man-made" paths are defined as integral objects and free relief will not be granted for interference of lie of ball, swing, or stance.

ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS – Areas marked by white lines/white dots are considered Ground Under Repair (GUR). Such GUR will be limited to lie of ball and area of intended swing only.

STONES IN BUNKERS: are deemed to be loose impediments (Rule 15.1) and may be removed; however, the act of removing stone must not cause the ball to move.

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS (STAIRS IN BUNKERS): If a players stance, swing or lie of ball is affected by stairs inside of a bunker, the player may take free relief by finding the nearest point of relief INSIDE the bunker (Rule 16.1c).

FIXED SPRINKLER HEADS CLOSE TO PUTTING GREENS: If a ball lies off the putting green, but not in a penalty area, and the sprinkler head, on or within two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball, **intervenes** on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief as follows: the ball shall be lifted and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay which (a) is not nearer the hole, (b) avoids such intervention and (c) is not in a penalty area or on a putting green. The ball may be cleaned when lifted.

RULE 20.1c(3): A player who is uncertain about the right procedure while playing a hole may complete the hole with two balls without penalty:

- The player must decide to play two balls after the uncertain situation arises and before making a stroke.
- The player should choose which ball will count if the Rules allow the procedure used for that ball, by announcing that choice to his or her marker or to another player before making a stroke.
- Players must report the facts to the committee before they return their scorecard.

MLR I-1.2: Prior to and after a round in stroke play, a player may practice on designated practice areas. On an official tournament round day, a player may not practice on the competition course before or between rounds.

MLR L-1: In the event a player returns their scorecard without player or marker certification, the penalty will be two strokes.
