

Local Rules - U.S. Kids Golf New Zealand Championship 2024

The Rules of Golf, U.S. Kids Golf State Invitational Rules & Regulations, and the following Local Rules govern all play on the course:

RULES/TOURNAMENT HOTLINE: If, during your round, you need a ruling or rules official, please call the tournament hotline on **+64 21 915 331**. Cell phones may ONLY be used by a player or caddie to **1**) access tournament information, **2**) obtain yardages via GPS, **3**) contact the rules hotline, or **4**) in emergency situations. Cell phones may not be used for any other purpose.

OUT OF BOUNDS: Is defined by the line between the course-side points at ground level of boundary fence posts plus white stakes and/or white line around the Club House, along the access drive, to the right of the 4th and 17th holes and behind the 3rd,9^{th,} and 16th greens. <u>Players must proceed under Stroke and Distance penalty.</u>

ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS (GUR): Is defined by a GUR sign or any area encircled by a white line

PENALTY AREAS: Penalty areas are defined by Red Stakes and/or Red Lines.

IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS CLOSE TO THE PUTTING GREEN: In addition to the types of interference described in Rule 16.1a, when a ball lies in the general area, interference also exists if any immovable obstruction is: on the players line of play, is within two club-lengths of the putting green and is within two club-lengths of the ball. The player may take relief under Rule 16.1 b. (Exception – There is no relief under this Local Rule if the player chooses a line of play that is clearly unreasonable.

STONES IN BUNKERS: Stones in bunkers are deemed <u>loose impediments</u>, as are leaves, pinecones, and the like. Removal of a loose impediment must not cause the ball to move (Rule 15.1).

<u>MLR I-1.2 -</u> Prior to and after a round in stroke play, a player may practice on designated practice areas. <u>On an official tournament round day, a player may not practice on their competition course before</u> <u>or between rounds.</u>

<u>MLR L-1 -</u> In the event a player returns their scorecard without player or marker certification, the penalty will be two strokes.
