

U.S. Kids Golf Tournament Access and Solicitation Policy (2026)

General Statement

The mission of U.S. Kids Golf (“USK”) is to foster the overall growth and development of young persons in competitive junior golf. At each USK golf Tournament, we strive to foster healthy competition in an environment that is safe and fun for our players, parents, coaches, USK Sponsors, spectators, and Host Facilities.

USK tournaments are made possible by the generous financial support of competitors and authorized USK Sponsors. We show our gratitude to USK Sponsors by giving them special privileges at tournaments, such as the opportunity to advertise to, market to, interact with, and build relationships with our players and their parents. USK tournaments should not be exploited by others for commercial or other financial advantage. When unauthorized people and companies use USK Tournaments as platforms to promote themselves, or their business, products, or services, they cause unwanted distractions, divert scarce USK resources, and most importantly, steal opportunities reserved for authorized USK Sponsors. Such self-serving behavior makes USK sponsorships less valuable and less attractive, and it therefore undermines USK’s ability to provide a curated atmosphere that provides the best possible experience and secures future opportunities for young golfers.

For these reasons, USK will not tolerate violations of this Policy; we ask all who support the vision and mission of USK to embrace it, abide by it, and assist in enforcing it.

Definitions

"USK Sponsor" means any person or entity that has entered an agreement with USK to be a sponsor, vendor, supplier, partner, or other contracted supporter of USK and/or the relevant Tournament.

"Host Facilities" means, for a given Tournament, the host club—including (without limitation) the golf course(s), clubhouse, practice facilities, and parking lot(s)—the host hotel(s), and any other sites where players and/or their families are instructed or invited to congregate for Tournament activities.

"On-Site" means a person’s presence at a Tournament, Host Facility, or at a location that provides access to a Host Facility during a Tournament.

"Representative" means any person acting, officially or unofficially, on behalf of any company, and includes any owner, employee, agent, contractor, or consultant of the company.

"Solicitation" means any type of activity (beyond a simple greeting) or communication (oral, written, digital, etc.) made for the purpose of initiating, pursuing, developing, or furthering a commercial or otherwise transactional relationship with the person so solicited or with any third party with whom the person so solicited may have influence. "Solicitation" includes such activities as arranging for or conducting meetings, distributing business cards or promotional materials (including flyers), distributing product samples, conducting demonstrations (in person or digitally) of any product or service, and exchanging information to facilitate any of the foregoing.

"Tournament" means any USK golf tournament (including world championships, regional championships, tournament qualifiers) and all related activities scheduled for that tournament, including registration, opening and closing ceremonies (such as the parade of nations), and other tournament-affiliated events. “Tournament” is not limited in time to actual days of competitive play but includes all scheduled events associated with a particular competition.

General Prohibition Against Solicitations

As a general matter, USK Tournaments are not open to the general public beyond our players, parents, coaches, USK Sponsors, spectators, and Host Facility personnel. Without the prior written permission of the USK, no Representative of any businesses or enterprise is permitted to:

- **Attend Tournaments in his/her capacity as a Representative.**
- **Engage in Solicitation while On-Site.**

For clarity, this general prohibition applies to Representatives of all businesses or enterprises of any kind or nature. Only Representatives of USK Sponsors or partners, or others with a prior written agreement of USK expressly allowing them to do so, may engage in any On-Site Solicitation only to the extent such Solicitation is in accordance with the specific terms of the relevant agreement between USK and such a USK Sponsor.

Enforcement

All USK facilities are closed to the general public beyond our players, parents, coaches, sponsors, spectators, and Host Club and Host Facility personnel during Tournaments, and there will be USK staff, Tournament staff, Tournament volunteers, and Host Club staff commissioned to assist with the enforcement of this Policy. USK may also hire on-duty or off-duty law enforcement officers to provide for the general security of Tournaments, in which case they will act to enforce this Policy as well.

Offenders should be aware that by violating this Policy, you make yourself a "trespasser" at the Host Facility. If a violator is a Representative of a Company, then all Representatives of such Company who are On-Site will also become "trespassers." While USK is not obligated to give any warnings beyond those required by law, generally, USK intends to follow the following procedures:

- Violators will receive a verbal warning from a USK Tournament staff member or volunteer and must immediately leave the Host Facility. If the Violator is a Representative of a Company that has other Representatives On-Site, all Representatives of the Company must also leave the Host Facility immediately.
- Once a violator has been asked to leave or removed from a Host Facility, no additional verbal warnings will be given if they appear at future Tournaments. On-Site security personnel and/or local authorities will be contacted immediately. If the violator is a Representative of a Company, then this applies to all other Representatives of the Company who may attend future Tournaments.
- Whenever the law permits, USK and the owner of the Host Facility reserve the right to press charges for criminal trespassing.
- No failure on the part of USK to enforce this Policy in a given circumstance shall constitute a waiver of our authority to do so.
- Nothing herein restricts USK from pursuing other remedies against violators, Representatives, and their companies that may be available at law, in equity, or under contract.

USK reserves the right to modify this Policy at any time, and/or to limit or prohibit On-Site access for any person, company, or Representative thereof to the extent permitted by law.
